

Information Statement - Dagderm Specialist Medical Practice

In accordance with Article 13 (1) and (2) of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 (GDPR), we inform you that:

- The data controller of your personal data is Dagderm Specialist Medical Practice, operated by Agnieszka Staniewska, with its registered office at Pasaż Ursynowski 1, unit U17, 02-784 Warsaw, Poland.
- 2. For all matters regarding the processing of your personal data, you may contact us by email at ochrona.danych@dagderm.pl, or by post to the above address, marked "Personal Data".
- 3. We process your personal data in our role as a healthcare provider, with the aim of delivering medical care and managing healthcare services and systems.
- 4. Providing your data is voluntary, but it is a necessary condition for receiving medical services (failure to provide them prevents us from performing medical services). Where data are processed based on legal requirements, providing them is mandatory. We may use your provided telephone number or email address (e.g. to confirm or cancel appointments, send reminders, inform you about preparation for procedures, or about test results).
- 5. As a healthcare provider, we are obliged to maintain and store your medical records for the duration required by law.
- 6. Your personal data will not be used for marketing purposes unless you give your explicit written consent. Such consent is voluntary and its absence will not affect your ability to use our services. You may withdraw your marketing consent at any time.
- 7. With all due safeguards, your data may be shared with:
 - o entities authorized by law to receive it;
 - processors acting on our behalf (such as suppliers of technical, IT, laboratory, postal, courier, legal, and accounting services);
 - o other medical entities with which Dagderm has contracts for providing medical services.
- 8. Data of individuals you have authorized will be processed to the extent specified by you (name, surname, date of birth, contact details).
- 9. You have the following rights:
 - o to access your data;
 - o to receive a copy;
 - o to rectify incorrect or outdated data;
 - o to erase your data;
 - o to restrict processing;
 - o to receive data portability;
 - o to object to processing;
 - to withdraw consent without affecting the lawfulness of processing carried out before withdrawal.

However, requesting changes to health assessments made by medical staff within their professional autonomy cannot be granted. If we deny your request, we will inform you within one month of receipt, citing the legal basis for refusal.

10. You have the right to lodge a complaint with the supervisory authority handling data protection, namely the President of the Polish Personal Data Protection Authority (UODO), should you suspect improper processing of your personal data.
